The United Nations is an international organisation of countries all over the world.

The United Nations is made up of 193 countries that work together.

Who started the United Nations?

The United Nations was set up after World War Two when lots of people died and were treated badly.

After the war, leaders of countries got together to work on protecting people from being treated badly.

How do the United Nations protect our rights?

These agreements are called conventions.



A convention that is important for Inclusion International's work is the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD)
